Welcome and Introductions

Sam Stroupe, Howard County Presiding Commissioner, welcomed attendees at 11:30 a.m. Introductions were made by those in attendance.

Presentation – Missouri Water Resources

Bob Hunt from Missouri Department of Natural Resources presented an overview of the Missouri Water Resources Plan. The plan is a long-range, comprehensive strategy to provide an understanding of our water resource needs. It will help ensure the quantity of Missouri's water resources will meet the future water demands by identifying current and future shortfalls in water supplies, and exploring options to address those needs. The goals and objectives of the plan are to:

- Evaluate current and future groundwater and surface water availability.
- Evaluate all water users such as drinking water supplies, agriculture, industry, navigation, and recreation, for their water needs.
- Develop projected water supply needs through the year 2060 taking into account projected population changes, new or increasing industry demands, and hydrologic conditions.
- Identify gaps in water availability based on water use projections.
- Identify water and wastewater infrastructure needs, funding, and financing opportunities.
- Identify impacts affecting water availability.
- Outline a series of strategies to help prepare us to meet our water needs.
- Gather input from citizens and stakeholders to help identify water resource priorities.

Five technical workgroups have been established by water plan topic area; Consumptive Needs, Non-Consumptive Needs, Infrastructure Needs, Agricultural Needs, and Water Quality. The technical workgroups provide guidance on technical analyses, give feedback to the development of technical products, identify and prioritize water resource issues, and provide recommendations on how to address those issues. This information will be incorporated into the Missouri Water Resources Plan.

Mid-MO RPC Staff Report

Executive Director David Bock briefly reviewed the RPC end of year financials for FY18 and highlighted current active CDBG projects that staff is currently working on.
