Agenda Item I. Call to Order

Kenny Kunze called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm. Introductions were made around the room by those in attendance.

Gary Jungermann motioned to approve the agenda. Larry Benz seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

There was a review of the May 24th, TAC meeting minutes for any additions or corrections. Larry Benz motioned to approve the minutes. Gary Jungermann seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item II. MoDOT Report

FY2018 TEAP Program – Kim Tipton reported the correct application due date is September 14th. FY18 grant program is being awarded for two years and is open to ADA transition plans. The grant will pay 80% of the total project cost, up to \$8,000 with the applicant providing 20% match. The next call for projects will be 2019.

Freight Enhancement Program – Mike Henderson gave a brief review of the FY18 program. Freight enhancement funds must be used for transportation purposes other than highways. The maximum available for any one project is \$500,000. A minimum of 20% of the project's cost must come from sources other than FRE funding. The application process and information is available on MoDOT website and was available in the agenda packet. Applications are due by 5 p.m. August 22th. Award notification will be no later than August 31, 2017.

Project Activity – Steve Engelbrecht reported on the following construction projects:

- Overlay on Highway 54 between Jefferson City and Kingdom City has been completed and stripping is in progress. High friction surfacing and guard cable work will begin next week.
- Highway 63 Katy Trail Bridge work is on schedule and will possibly open next week.
- Overlay in Columbia I-70 Rocheport Bridge at St. Charles Road is underway.
- The deck has just been poured on the Taos interchange bridge.

Agenda Item III. Mid-MO RPC Activity Update

Ed Siegmund reported on the following project activities:

Mid-MO RPC staff is currently reaching out to counties to discuss and rate their transportation projects for the Regional Transportation Needs List. Project completion is expected by August 31, 2017.

The Mid-MO RPC FY18 Transportation Work Program has been completed, submitted and recently been approved by MoDOT staff.

There will be a conference call this week regarding funding recommendation for the Burnett School Road Bridge, Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) application.

Mid-MO RPC staff is currently working on collecting data for Moniteau County low water crossings and bridges. An interactive database is being created with location and description of each. Detection of dangerous crossings will be noted if there is currently no signage.

Callaway County officials have entered into an agreement with the City of Jefferson and Cole County for a port feasibility study. The study should be complete this fall which will determine the need and possible location of a multi-modal port on the Missouri River near Jefferson City.

Agenda Item IV. Local Reports

Doug Reese – The City of St. Martins Aldermen hopes to use TAP funds next year to construct sidewalks from Apache Flats to St. Martins School.

Eric Barron – The Stadium round-about in Jefferson City is scheduled to open before the beginning of the 2017-2018 school year. Capitol Ave is being widened to provide bike lanes from the Capitol to the old prison. Due to an administration reorganization Barron is now supervisor over Planning and Zoning and the two CAMPO planning staff as well, who are currently working on the evaluation of the system wide JeffTran assessment survey.

Larry Benz – Cole County partnered with the City of Jefferson and Helias High School to construct a dual lane round-about. Project completion date is August 31.

Mike Henderson – The 2018-2022 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) was approved July 11, 2017. MoDOT is currently updating the state long range plan to bring it in line with the FAST ACT.

Gary Jungermann reported work continues on Highway H bridge over Davis Creek and Highway O bridge over Crows Fork Creek in Callaway County.

Kenny Kunze reported after several weeks of closure the county has finally been assigned a new county clerk. Moniteau County sales tax is down 3%.
