Agenda Item I. Call to Order

Kenny Kunze called the meeting to order at 2:00 pm. Introductions were made around the room by those in attendance.

Larry Benz motioned to approve the agenda. Howard McMillian seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

There was a review of the July 26th, TAC meeting minutes for any additions or corrections. Larry Benz motioned to approve the minutes. Don Baragary seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item II. TEAP Applications

David Bock gave a brief review of the five Traffic Engineering Assistance Program (TEAP) applications in the MoDOT Central District region. There was a short discussion following each of the following: Cities of Ashland; Holts Summit, Richland, St. James and Sunrise Beach. TAC county representatives were asked to prioritize the application submissions based on the given MoDOT criteria.

Agenda Item III. MoDOT Report

Steve Engelbracht presented an overview of MoDOT's update of the Long Range Transportation Program (LRTP). This is a 25 year vision for transportation needs in the state. MoDOT will seek public participation online from September 11 through October 11. Input through a survey will help confirm goals and rank transportation priorities. Review of the draft LRTP document is scheduled for Winter 2018.

Project Activity – Steve Engelbrecht reported on the following construction projects:

- Kingdom City bridge rehabilitation in the westbound lanes continues. One westbound lane is open through the work area.
- Highway 54 project from Jefferson City to Kingdom City is scheduled for completion in early 2018.

Agenda Item IV. Mid-MO RPC Activity Update

David Bock reported on the following project activities:

The Regional Transportation Needs List has been updated. Regional projects have been rated a high, medium and low priority. There was discussion on changing the update process of this list. The new process would be an yearly meeting with each county commission, an area engineer, TAC representative, RPC staff and MoDOT representative, to discuss their transportation needs and decide what are the top three transportation priorities are for their county. The committee members present had no issues with the new process as outlined.

The Burnett School Road Bridge has been selected to be funded through the Missouri Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP). The bridge extends over Cedar Creek joining Boone and Callaway Counties. The project completion date will be September 2019.

RPC staff has been identifying and creating a GIS map of low water crossings in Moniteau County. The map will show every low water crossing in the county and distinguish between various types of low water crossings. The mapping tool can be used to assist county officials in prioritizing maintenance and safety projects.

Ed Siegmund reported the RPC's contract with Central Missouri Community Action (CMCA) for the Mobility Management project will expire on September 30th. The goal of the project was to focus on identifying and alleviating transportation barriers for challenged populations. A project report is being generated and a presentation will be given at the next TAC meeting.

Agenda Item V. Local Reports

Gary Jungermann reported that the Fulton Medical Center in Callaway County will remain open.

Kenny Kunze reported new windows have been installed on the lower level of the Moniteau County courthouse.

Don Baragary reported overlay has been underway and crack sealing to begin on the roadways. Baragary attended a legislative town hall meeting in Cooper County, and due to MoDOT's lack of funding, there was strong indication that state letter roads would be turned over to the county for maintenance.
