Agenda Item 1. Call to Order

Gary Jungermann called the meeting to order at 2:04pm. Introductions were made around the room by those in attendance.

Larry Benz moved to approve the agenda. Don Baragary seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

There was a review of the September 25, 2019 minutes for any additions or corrections. Don Baragary made a motion to approve the minutes. Larry Benz seconded. Motion passed.

Agenda Item II. Mo Coalition for Roadway Safety Presentation

Jon Nelson with the Mo Coalition for Roadway Safety gave a presentation on what the Coalition does and MoDOT's efforts to promote safe driving and reduction of accidents in an effort toward the goal of zero deaths on Mo roadways. The latest version of Missouri's Blue Print to safety comes out 2020. There are funds and resources available to do awareness events such as booths at festivals or high school education campaigns and docudramas.

Agenda Item III. Regional Transportation Needs List Prioritization

The updated needs list for the region was presented. A large ticket item, the Rocheport Bridge, came off the list. Some other items were added to the list during the individual county meetings. Cooper, Callaway, and Cole county currently have worked with MoDOT or gone on their own to pave or work on some road approaches where county gravel roads meet up with State roads and may have issues. Boone and Howard expressed interest in doing something similar in areas where loose gravel may make it unsafe for vehicles to get onto a state road, or traffic makes it difficult to turn graders around at the end of a county road.

Multi-modal projects were discussed. The Columbia Regional airport was expressed as a large regional need, but sidewalk safety for children around schools and rail safety projects and crossings were of interest as well.

Mac Finley moved to approve the list to go to MoDOT in current form. Don Baragary seconded. Motion passed.

Agenda Item IV. MoDOT Update

Bridge work is moving forward in our counties. Ashland roundabout is moving forward. TEAP funding for Fulton's ADA Transition Plan has been approved.

Agenda Item V. Local Reports

Fulton looking at taking Bus 54 from Collier to Westminster to 3 lanes. Looking for funding opportunities for that project currently. Also waiting on Federal Highway grant for 2nd St. bridge.

Agenda Item VI. Announcements/Information

LWCF/RTP grants are open currently and will remain open until February 14, 2020. Land Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) is a 50% minimum match program that helps fund recreation improvements and additions such as shelter houses, pools, ballfields, playground equipment and much more. Recreational Trails Program (RTP) is a 20% minimum match that assists in building trails and trailhead amenities.

Governor's Cost Share award announcement was sent out. 20 projects were funded throughout the state. 2 projects were in the Mid-MO RPC region. The City of Jefferson received funding for three roundabouts along Clark Ave. corridor. The City of Columbia received funding to create a connecting road between Discovery Parkway/63 interchange and Rolling Hills Rd/New Haven intersection.
