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Area F Counties Receive Disaster Supplies for Mass Care Sheltering

Thirteen Mid-Missouri counties recently received supplies for emergency mass care sheltering. Each county received \$18,778 of cots, blankets, pillows, and a box trailer for transporting the supplies to shelter locations. Area F counties receiving supplies include Audrain, Boone, Callaway, Camden, Cole, Cooper, Gasconade, Howard, Miller, Moniteau, Montgomery, Morgan, and Osage counties. The supplies are part of a mass care disaster preparedness project approved by the Regional Homeland Security Oversight Committee (RHSOC). Other aspects of the project include identifying disaster shelter locations, and

training volunteers to assist in the shelters.

"If a disaster occurs in Mid-Missouri, this project will better prepare our counties to provide shelter for citizens," states Gary Woodson, RHSOC Chair. "It also provides emergency assets that can be shared between counties." Funding for the project was provided by United States Department of Homeland Security and was designated by the Area RHSOC. Mid-Missouri Regional Planning Commission serves as the administrative and fiscal agent for RHSOC and coordinated the purchase and distribution of the supplies to each county. Local volun-

teers and businesses assisted with distribution.

The RHSOC works through the Department of Public Safety, Division of Homeland Security and State Emergency Management Agency to administer plans, projects, and grant programs at the regional level. The RHSOC is comprised of one representative of fifteen core disciplines - Emergency Management, Police, Sheriff, Fire, Health, Homeland Security Response Team (HSRT), Public Works, Municipal Governments, County Governments, Private Industry/Utility, Emergency Medical Service, 911, Volunteer sector, Agriculture, and Education.

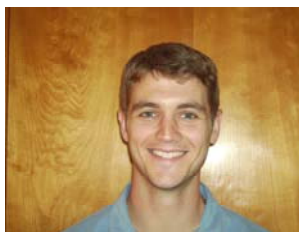
MidMO RPC Staff Updates

Coordinated Public Transit-Human Service Plan

In August 2005, Congress passed the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient, Transportation, Equity Act: A legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU), reauthorizing the surface transportation act. A locally developed and adopted Coordinated Public Transit-Human Service Plan is required for the funding process.

The Mid-Missouri Regional Planning Commission Board of Directors

adopted this plan in August 2008, meeting the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) requirement for funding programs that include; Transportation for Elderly Individuals and Individuals with Disabilities (5310), Job Access and Reverse Commute (JARC 5316) and The New Freedom Initiative (5317). With the adoption of this plan funding programs can

continue forward. The Mid-Missouri RPC non-urban areas are current with the FTA funding requirement of Coordinated Public Transit-Human Service Plan with this adoption.
